

Laura Maria Isabel Ruiz Ocadiz: A Trailblazing Filmmaker Breaking Cinematic Conventions



like Bellas Artes, developing a keen appreciation for rhythm that would later translate into film montage. Her father, Enrique Guillermo Ruiz de la Torre, played a pivotal role in her education, instilling in her a love for scientific thinking and academic endeavor.

Television and Theater

Pursuing a science degree, she became drawn to the performing arts. Advised by an industry mentor, she landed featured extra roles in several Mexican soap operas, Emerging from the Mexican independent film industry, Ruiz Ocadiz is a name that resonates particularly in Europe and Asia. A versatile artist whose career spans acting, writing, and directing, her expressionistic style merges thought-provoking visuals and poetic prose into an unforgiving narrative.

Early Life and Artistic Foundations

Born in 1983, in Mexico City, Ruiz Ocadiz was raised in an eclectic environment of musicians, mathematicians, and physiologists. Influenced by her uncle, Ricardo Ocadiz, a concert pianist and one of Mexico's jazz predecessors, she grew up amid the complexity of jazz and classical performances at venues





including CLAP (2003) and Reb3lde (2004). Trained in musical theater at the Artestudio Academy, she performed in productions such as Newsies (2004) and Peter Pan (2005), where, despite showing acting prowess, she was enthralled by the magic happening behind the scenes and joined the stagehand team, much to her drama teacher's dismay.

Majoring in clinical psychology, her thesis on the incidence of eating disorders in ballet dancers was praised as the best research work of 2007 by her university. This would later influence her crafting of deeply human and emotionally resonant fiction.





Writing and Filmmaking


Becoming a film critic for the magazine F.I.L.M.E. motivated her screenwriting endeavors. Enrolling in the prestigious Sogem (General Society of Writers of Mexico) school, she was granted a "Melodrama Writer" scholarship by Telemundo. Determined to refine her directorial skills after shooting her first short film, both lauded and censored for its bold imagery, she pursued a master's in cinematography at Altrafilmica (2015-2017) and met Juan Pablo Cortés (Love Hurts, 2002), an esteemed film editor of whom she became an apprentice.

After obtaining her first job in the industry as Production Assistant of the feature film Sátiros (Roberto Mares. 2017), she married actor and producer Roberto Arenas (Paul Ragsdale's Farquet Murdercise. 2023) and authored the novels Amnesty (2018) and Steve's Canotier (2021), exercising a "cinematic" prose earned her a reputation among readers as "creator of a new genre.".

The combined experience



would lead her to write and direct the 2021 shorts Neither You Nor I, Misplace the Rabbits, and We Are A Motive; and the silent, experimental short Love Without a Casket (2022). Her work attained over 60 laurels, including 38 awards and nominations, including Best Short Film in Rome and South Africa, Best Director in New York City and India, and Best Human/Women's Rights Film in Munich and Iran; also becoming a nominee in Cannes and Tokyo and a finalist in London and Nigeria.






A Visionary Redefining the Crafts of Storytelling



Treading the darkest realms of the psychosocial being, this fearless director employs various unconventional cameras to modify reality, leading us to a non-existent past and the eternal fear of a cruel and uncertain future.



Her colorful blend of flesh-and-bone, puppet, and cartoon characters creates a contrast between freshness and disturbance, allowing us to savor her directing of arduous performances facing the intangible, the surreptitious, the unconscious of the world they've been plunged into.



Maria Ruiz Ocadiz demonstrates that movies can be felt from the gut, creating an atmosphere of estrangement in her characters, expressing humanity's erratic passing through this world, driven by a dichotomy of the soul.









Mara Lesemann: From Finance to Film - A Journey of Passion and Persistence

Mara Lesemann's journey from the world of banking to the heart of independent filmmaking is a testament to resilience, passion, and artistic ambition. With a strong academic foundation, having attended Brown University and later earning a BA in Media Studies with a concentration in screenwriting from The New School in New York City, Lesemann carved an unconventional path into the film industry. Her expertise in foreign exchange within the banking sector may seem worlds apart from cinema, but her analytical skills and business acumen have undoubtedly contributed





to her success as an indie movie producer and screenwriter.

Lesemann's breakout film, Detours, showcased her ability to blend heartfelt storytelling with humor and realism. The indie feature stars Tara Westwood (Plane, The Grudge, Triggered), Carlo Fiorletta (Arriving Separately, upcoming Indigo Blue), Richard Kind (Argo, A Serious Man), and the late, great Paul Sorvino (Goodfellas, Nixon). The film follows a newly single woman who embarks on a transformative road trip with her widowed father as she relocates to Florida.

Through its compelling characters and engaging narrative, Detours resonates with audiences seeking both emotional depth and lighthearted moments. The film is widely available on major streaming platforms, including Amazon Prime, Tubi, Apple TV, and Hoopla.

Prior to Detours, Lesemann wrote and produced Surviving Family, a powerful drama that delves into themes of alcoholism, mental illness, and the complex bonds of family. Starring Billy Magnussen (Road House, Coup!) and Phyllis Somerville (Little Children, Stoker), the film follows a young woman who returns home with a fiancé and a five-day wedding plan, only to confront the ghosts of her past. Lauded for its raw and authentic family dynamics, portrayal of Surviving Family continues to reach audiences on platforms such as Plex, Tubi, Amazon Prime, YouTube Movies & TV, and Apple TV.





Currently in development, Lesemann's latest project, Alison, takes on an even more profound narrative, inspired by true events. The film tells the harrowing yet deeply human story of a mother fighting for her schizophrenic and autistic daughter while her husband struggles to keep the family afloat amid financial hardships.



The film takes a dramatic turn as life spirals into crisis. With acclaimed actress Marla Gibbs (The Jeffersons, 227) attached to the project, Alison promises to be another deeply moving and socially relevant film in Lesemann's body of work.

Beyond her personal projects, Lesemann is a dedicated script consultant and ghostwriter, helping shape stories that bring fresh perspectives to the industry. Her expertise and keen storytelling instincts have made her a sought-after voice in independent cinema.








As a leading campaigner Fay is fighting to 'Save Barrows Lane football fields and community hall' for the health and safety of children, young people, and all residents in Yardley.






RON CHEPESIUK: THE MASTER STORYTELLER OF TRUE CRIME

In the realm of true crime storytelling, few names carry the weight and credibility of Ron Chepesiuk. A prolific and award-winning author, screenwriter, and documentary producer, Chepesiuk has built a remarkable career spanning decades, with over 40 published books and more than 4,000 articles featured in various newspapers and magazines. His deep expertise in crime history, investigative journalism, and cinematic storytelling makes him a powerhouse in the entertainment industry.






Chepesiuk's literary works are a testament to his dedication to uncovering the hidden narratives behind some of history's most notorious figures. His book The Real Mr.

Big was a finalist for both the 2022 International Book Awards and the National Indie Excellence Awards, further cementing his status as a leading voice in crime literature.

Beyond books, Chepesiuk has successfully transitioned into film and television. His investigative prowess and masterful storytelling have led to multiple screenplays being optioned and developed for the big screen. Among them, Death Fences was honored as the Grand Winner at the 2019 New Visions International Film Festival, and The Blackamoor won the Grand Winner prize at the 1921 Rio International Film Festival.





Additionally, four of his books have been optioned for film adaptations, showcasing the industry's recognition of his work's cinematic potential.

Chepesiuk's documentary work is equally impressive. His film on Frank Matthews received the Silver Doc Award at the Las Vegas International Film Festival, and his latest documentary, The Narco Next Door, inspired by his book The Real Mr. Big, is set to premiere on the Discovery Channel on March 20, 2025. His ability to translate his investigative research into compelling visual storytelling underscores his versatility as a filmmaker and producer.



As a crime historian and media consultant, Chepesiuk has contributed to popular television programs such as Gangland TVand has appeared on major networks including Discovery, National Geographic, and **NBC** Dateline. His expertise is sought after not only for his in-depth knowledge of crime syndicates but also for his ability to contextualize their

impact on society. His work has taken him across more than 35 countries, providing firsthand insights into the global crime landscape and allowing him to interview influential figures such as Jimmy Carter, Yasser Arafat, and John Kerry.





Chepesiuk's influence extends to digital media as well. As the host of *Crime Beat Radio*, a globally recognized show with over 90 million downloads in 160+ countries, he has interviewed renowned personalities like James Patterson, Robert Kennedy Jr., Henry Hill, and Noam Chomsky. 
The Doctor is a documentary about the life of Franjo Grotenhermen, a pioneering doctor who saw the therapeutic potential of medicinal cannabis


A doctor, a researcher, and a political activist who has been fighting for the right of his patients to have legal access to medical cannabis.



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FRANK MANCUSO: A JOURNEY FROM LAW ENFORCEMENT TO AWARD-WINNING FILMMAKER

Frank Mancuso's journey into filmmaking is a testament to perseverance, adaptability, the of and power storytelling. From his early aspirations in acting to his distinguished career in law enforcement and. ultimately, his award-winning emergence as an screenwriter and filmmaker, Mancuso's path has been anything conventional. Today, with an impressive portfolio of 17 screenplays and multiple film productions, he is a respected figure in the independent film industry. Born and raised in Albany, NY, Mancuso's passion for performance led him to New York City in 1983. After graduating from the College of St. Rose, he pursued an acting career, studying at the esteemed HB Studio under the guidance of Bill Hickey.





Like many actors, he started with background roles before securing his AFTRA card with an appearance on the soap opera *Ryan's Hope*. His breakthrough came in 1985 when he earned his SAG card with a speaking role as a police officer alongside Peter Weller in *Apology*.

Despite his early success in acting, Mancuso found himself navigating the challenges of sustaining a career in the industry.

To support himself, he worked at Madison Square Garden for 25 years as a Supervisor of Events. However, his path took an unexpected turn when he pursued a career in law enforcement.

Over the next two decades, Mancuso served as a Court Officer in Mt. Vernon, an Evidence Specialist with the NYPD, and eventually a NYC Deputy Sheriff. His service as a 9/11 First Responder further cemented his dedication to public service.

Throughout his career in law enforcement, Mancuso's passion for storytelling never waned. His experiences in the field became a wellspring of inspiration for his writing, shaping his ability to craft compelling, authentic narratives. After retiring, he fully embraced his creative ambitions, transitioning into screenwriting and independent filmmaking.





Partnering with Chris Adams, he cofounded a production company that has since completed six projects, with their latest now in post-production.



Mancuso's screenplays critical have garnered several acclaim, with listed on INKTIP and available for production. His first screenplay, S.T.A.N.E, won Best Action at the Mega Fest Las Vegas International Film and Screenwriting Festival in 2019. His filmography includes Blue Iron, SHIFT, The and Devil's Playground, showcasing his versatility across genres.

His film *Anemone* is currently available for streaming on Amazon Prime, further solidifying his presence in the industry.

Among his recent works, A Melody in the Bronx stands out as an adaptation of Rocco Trombetta's book, There Once Was A Melody in the Bronx. This project exemplifies Mancuso's ability to bring literary works to life on screen, merging poignant storytelling with cinematic vision.

Amanat, who holds Canadian citizenship, claims that the video contains an unexpected twist that viewers will be surprised to see, and that the song is a treat to listen to.





It On This.



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


The core spindle of the story tells not only the relationship between grandma and granddaughter but also hopes to bring everyone a growth story with the memory of Taichung City.
